Procedure for Submitting New Ideas, Suggestions, Proposals

The Garden Managers, Leaders and advisors of the Friends of Culverhouse Community Garden welcome ideas, suggestions and proposals from individual or groups of CCG members. The following is the procedure for submitting, investigating and potentially implementing these ideas or proposals:

1. Garden Member proposes an idea to the Garden Leaders. (Leaders names are found on a roster online that we strive to keep up-to-date. http://culverhousegarden.org/?page_id=922)
2. Leaders investigate existing county Community Garden and Park rules and regulations for possible conflict.
3. Member making a proposal must include a cost analysis and/or cost estimate.
4. Leaders assess financial impact to the garden.
5. Leaders may poll the general membership and other stakeholders before making a decision.
6. Leaders approve or reject the idea. If funds are required for the project, the Chairperson of FCCG instructs the FCCG Treasurer to request a check from FOSCP.

Example of ideas that have gone through this process:

- Let's grow fruit trees inside the garden fence. (approved)
- Let's have identification tags for gardeners. (not approved)
- Let's install a keypad on the gate to replace the chain & combination lock. (approved)
- Let's have a large-scale composting project. (approved)
