Culverhouse Community Garden - General Members Meeting

Wed, May 8, 4:00 to 5:30, at Twin Lakes Park Meeting Room

On Wednesday, May 8th, the Culverhouse Community Garden members gathered at Twin Lakes to hear a presentation on the current organization and leadership of the Gardens.

Dave Consbruck, Garden Chair, explained various aspects of the day to day operational procedures.

Attached is an overview of who does what. Marci is in charge of operations, David of infrastructure, Leila of common areas in the garden and Inge Saake will be responsible for demonstrations gardens. Catherine will oversee the website and communications effort.

Hopefully, the park will be open to the public in June (Yea!) but no date has been determined at this time. That will allow us to go in and out freely without the necessity of locking the park entrance gate. However, we will still need to lock and unlock the garden gate if we are first or last to be there. You may be required to turn on the water so if you do not know how, now is the time to learn.

If you are planning to be away for the summer it is requested that you cover your garden with straw, mulch or cover crop so that the weeds don't take over.

Plans for outreach and fundraising are underway. Grant requests are being written and hopefully, will yield much needed funds so that we can continue to upgrade and develop the common areas of the garden.

Two of our (West Quad) demonstration plots are being planted with various melons and another will have a bamboo pyramid structure erected to support bean vines. Thank you Tom and Renee.

The water pressure continues to be of concern. Please do not open your faucet and leave the hose unattended. Coordination is the key so if you see someone watering, ask them to tell you when they finish so you can start. If we only have one or two at a time then the pressure will be up. This problem should disappear once the garden is open full time so please be patient.

Your cooperation in following these guidelines will help provide a safe and viable community garden.

Locks: Please ensure the security of the garden and its water system by keeping all lock combinations private, with access by garden members only.

Operation

County Park rules apply to all gardeners: See sign in parking lot.

County Extension Community Garden rules apply: See sign on garden fence.

• Entering: Unlock shed and turn ON water system: see laminated chart on fence and in shed for directions.

- For water problems: Refer to *Who to Call List* above the battery box in shed.
- Sign in and list common area work performed and the time spent doing it.
- Exiting: Turn OFF water system and lock the shed if you are the last to leave no matter what time of day.

Gardener's Responsibilities

- Your Garden Plot: actively garden. Keep your plot weed free and tidy, summer cover if away.
- Paths: weed and renew mulch on paths surrounding your plot.
- Raised beds: Use Trex or untreated wood.
- Plants Not Allowed: bamboo, banana, mint, marijuana.
- Blue Plot Cornerstones: blue indicates water pipe lines exercise care when digging.
- Water Conservation: follow best-practices watering principles add humus to soil, use surface mulches, water roots not leaves, avoid hilled rows, water only when necessary [moisture meter in shed].
- Hoses: drain, coil and hang on brackets after use. Close faucet.
- Tools and Shed: keep tools and shed clean and organized. Renew supplies [or alert GMs]
- Common Areas: renew mulch as needed, keep garden grounds neat, help maintain landscaping, volunteer for manure hauling and collecting composting materials.
- Compost Piles: help build, adopt, label and maintain. Refer to the Composting Process sheet in Garden Notebook which is available in the shed.
- Volunteer Events: participate in scheduled events.

Safety

- Lock garden gates when attendance is sparse, preferentially don't come alone, bring a cell phone.
- Call 911 for medical emergencies. Give location: 7301 McIntosh Road, Culverhouse Nature Park. Fire and Police departments have the park address and an up-to-date map to entrance.
- Keep Tetanus shots up to date. Stay alert. Protect yourself against fire ants, mosquitoes, excessive sun exposure and dehydration.
- Personal Injury Accidents: Report personal injury accidents resulting from performing volunteer work in the common areas of the garden to Stacy Spriggs at 861-9815.
