- 2. We have made a commitment to keep \$3,000 in Reserve for emergency repairs to our water system as a self-insurance fund.
- 3. In 2016, we plan to use \$3,000 to create a Quiet Garden/Meditation Area in the NW corner of the garden thanks to the generous donation from the Schober Foundation, which is managed by garden member Ina Curless.
- 4. The remaining \$1,605.82 in the Friends Treasury may be requested by Culverhouse Community Garden Managers for garden needs above and beyond those covered by the \$25 annual plot fee, which is paid directly to Sarasota County Community Garden Program. The Program provides such services as the top soil that we order every year, replacement tools, garden repairs that are not time-sensitive, etc.
